Do you know the indispensable part of your computer that is more than a century old? The modern typewriter born in the back of Kleinstenbark of Aleinstenbark of Kleinstenbark o was born in the back of Kleinsteuber's Machine Shop in Milwaukee. That's where Christopher Sholes took some piano wire and a telegraph key and built a superfuzzy piano wire and a telegraph key and built a crude typing device in 1868. It could type only one letter, a rather fuzzylooking w, but it was still pretty amazing for its time.
